WHAT IS A PRAISE TEAM?

A Praise Team is a small group of people who lead other people in singing hymns and choruses. Although harmony may be sung, a Praise Team helps carry the melody.

WHY HAVE A PRAISE TEAM?

The presence of a Praise Team takes away the focus on one central worship leader. This helps create a more intimate worship atmosphere for the congregation. A Praise Team also gives a traditional service a contemporary feel.

A Praise Team may be used in addition to a choir or stand alone.

A Praise Team is more flexible than a full choir making it easier to provide worship leadership for multiple services.



TIPS FOR BEING A GREAT PRAISE TEAM LEADER

Have a daily private worship time.

Whether it's at home, in your car or on a walk, sing and talk to God. Spend time in God's Word.

Hold the microphone close to your mouth.

The sound techs will adjust your level. They can always turn you down but if your mike is not close they may not be able to turn you up.

Be expressive.

Be sensitive to the words of songs. When appropriate smile, clap and raise your hands. Practice these things at your private time of worship.

Memorize words to songs.

This will give you the freedom to look around and make eye contact with the congregation. It will also help you as you worship expressively. You are also prepared if the words on the screens fail to appear.

Dress appropriately.

There will be times your team will agree on certain attire. Strive to look contemporary and modest. Ladies, please be covered from shoulders to knees.

Be Confident!

Your posture and body language will send a message to other worshipers that what we are doing is important. We are singing to our God. Make sure your questions about where to stand and when to move are answered before worship begins.
